From Awareness to Recycling Service

During the Summer of 2017, the Society distributed cloth & jute bags to the people at local markets / rhythu bazaars. After talking to the people who carry plastic bags, we used to replace them bags with cloth bags. It was our regular job to educate them about the menace created by extra-plastics. For about 2234 'Plastic Free India' cloth bags distributed freely & 4000 bags were sold at subsidized price. Municipal Corporation helped the Society in establishing a recycling. This project would help to see the clean seas. The campaign is also initiated in Mangalore, Chandrapur, Indore & Lucknow.

Humanitarian-aid for Education & Livelihood Process (HELP)

The HELP project provided 83 pairs of uniforms & 19 sets of books to deserved students in three schools. The Society also helped 4 students with basic needs and they were also supported with a total amount of Rs. 34000 for their fees as they are semi-orphans. The team organized a survey on employment. It is found that 'Security Guards & Cab Drivers have much demand,' and was shared with the Project Director, GVMC.

Used Clothes to the Needy

There was a huge response to the collection of used clothes and utensils programme. The Society thanked everyone who gave new & used clothes and blankets for the tribal in Aruku.

Assistance for Victims in road trash & Awareness to Students / Youth

22 Traffic Awareness / road rash programmes were organized at various junctions in Visakhapatnam city and colleges. 2 victims were helped with first aid expenses and immediate assistance for their treatment was provided for their assistance. In this project, the Society has several plans to collaborate with AP Police Department and made a proposal to help the disabled in the traffic accidents through empowering confidence in them and assist them with any kind of livelihood.

Pioneered Cycling Club

Through our patrons, the team helped Children Athletes and Martial Arts with Rs. 22,500/- for organizing their sports meet and kits/ uniforms. The team contributed expenses and moral support in establishing a District Cycling Association.
